#### **FY 2016 Homeland Security Grant Program**

The FY 2016 Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP) is comprised of three related grant programs: State Homeland Security Program (SHSP), Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI), and Operation Stonegarden (OPSG). The intent of the FY 2016 HSGP is to provide grant funding to implement investments that build, sustain, and deliver the 32 core capabilities essential to achieving the National Preparedness Goal of a secure and resilient Nation.

The HSGP Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) will be released and allocations under SHSP and UASI will be announced on February 16, 2016. The following are descriptions of each HSGP component program along with FY 2016 allocations, as applicable:

#### **State Homeland Security Program**

In FY 2016, the State Homeland Security Program (SHSP) provides \$402,000,000 to support the implementation of state homeland security strategies to address identified planning, organization, equipment, training, and exercise needs to prevent, protect against, mitigate, respond to, and recover from acts of terrorism and other catastrophic events. Per section 2006 of the *Homeland Security Act of 2002*, as amended, (6 U.S.C. § 607), The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) is required to ensure that at least 25 percent (25%) of grant funding appropriated for grants awarded under HSGP's authorizing statute are used for law enforcement terrorism prevention activities. FEMA meets this requirement, in part, by requiring all SHSP and UASI recipients to ensure that at least 25 percent (25%) of the combined HSGP funds allocated under SHSP and UASI are dedicated towards law enforcement terrorism prevention activities (LETPA), as defined in 6 U.S.C. § 607. The LETPA allocation can be from SHSP, UASI or both. The table below specifies SHSP allocations for FY 2016:

# FY 2016 Homeland Security Grant Program: Urban Area Security Initiative

In FY 2016, the Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) program provides \$580,000,000 to address the unique planning, organization, equipment, training, and exercise needs of high-threat, high-density urban areas, and assists them in building an enhanced and sustainable capacity to prevent, protect against, mitigate, respond to, and recover from acts of terrorism. Per 6 U.S.C. § 607, FEMA is required to ensure that at least 25 percent (25%) of grant funding appropriated for grants awarded under HSGP's authorizing statute are used for law enforcement terrorism prevention activities. DHS/FEMA meets this requirement, in part, by requiring all SHSP and UASI recipients to ensure that at least 25 percent (25%) of the combined HSGP funds allocated under SHSP and UASI are dedicated towards law enforcement terrorism prevention activities, as defined in 6 U.S.C. § 607. The LETPA allocation can be from SHSP, UASI or both. This requirement does not include award funds from OPSG. The table below specifies allocations under the UASI program for the twenty-nine (29) areas the Secretary designated as eligible in FY 2016, in keeping with the intent of Congress expressed in the Joint Explanatory Statement accompanying the *Department of Homeland Security Appropriation's Act*, 2016 (Pub. L. No. 114-113) that the program fund up to 85 percent of nationwide risk:

# FY 2016 Homeland Security Grant Program:

# **Operation Stonegarden**

The FY 2016 Operation Stonegarden (OPSG) program provides \$55,000,000 to enhance cooperation and coordination among local, tribal, territorial, state, and Federal law enforcement agencies in a joint mission to secure the United States' borders along routes of ingress from international borders to include travel corridors in states bordering Mexico and Canada, as well as states and territories with international water borders.

#### FY 2016 Urban Area Security Initiative Nonprofit Security Grant Program

In FY 2016, the Nonprofit Security Grant Program (NSGP) provides \$20,000,000 in funding support for target hardening and other physical security enhancements and activities to nonprofit organizations that are at high risk of terrorist attack and located within one of the specific UASI-designated Urban Areas. The intent of the FY 2016 NSGP is to competitively award grant funding to assist nonprofit organizations in obtaining the resources required to support and integrate the preparedness activities of non-profit organizations that are at high risk of a terrorist attack with broader state and local preparedness efforts. The program seeks to integrate nonprofit preparedness activities with broader state and local preparedness efforts. It is also designed to promote coordination and collaboration in emergency preparedness activities among public and private community representatives, as well as State and local government agencies. Awards will be made on a competitive basis from eligible applicants within the following designated UASI areas.

# FY 2016 Tribal Homeland Security Grant Program

In FY 2016, the Tribal Homeland Security Grant Program (THSGP) provides up to \$10,000,000 to directly eligible tribes to help strengthen the Nation against risks associated with potential terrorist attacks. The intent of the FY 2016 THSGP is to competitively award grant funding to assist eligible tribes in obtaining the resources required to support the building, sustainment, and delivery of core capabilities essential to achieving the National Preparedness Goal of a secure and resilient Nation.

#### **FY 2016 Intercity Bus Security Grant Program**

In FY 2016, the Intercity Bus Security Grant Program (IBSGP) provides \$3,000,000 to owners and operators of intercity bus systems to protect critical surface transportation infrastructure and the traveling public from acts of terrorism and to increase the resilience of transit infrastructure. The intent of the FY 2016 IBSGP is to award grant funding to assist owners and operators of intercity bus systems in obtaining the resources required to support the development and sustainment of core capabilities identified in the National Preparedness Goal of a secure and resilient Nation. Applicants must have completed a vulnerability assessment and developed a security plan that the Secretary of Homeland Security has approved as described in Section 1531 of the *Implementing Recommendations of the 9/11 Commission Act of 2007* (6 U.S.C. § 1181).

Eligibility for funding is limited to applicants that meet one or both of the following criteria:

- Operate fixed-route intercity bus transportation providing services to a defined Urban Areas Security Initiative (UASI) jurisdiction.
- Operate a charter bus service using over-the-road buses and provide a minimum of 50 trips annually to one or more defined UASI jurisdictions.

Funds will be awarded on a competitive basis to eligible applicants that serve the following designated UASI areas.

# 2016 Intercity Passenger Rail (IPR) - Amtrak Grant Program

In FY 2016, the Intercity Passenger Rail (IPR) - Amtrak Program provides \$10,000,000 to Amtrak to develop security enhancements for eligible intercity passenger rail operations. The intent of the FY 2016 IPR is to grant funding to assist the Amtrak rail system in obtaining the resources required to support the development and sustainment of core capabilities identified in National Preparedness Goal of a secure and resilient Nation.

# **FY 2016 Port Security Grant Program**

In FY 2016, the Port Security Grant Program (PSGP) provides \$100,000,000 for transportation infrastructure security activities to implement Area Maritime Transportation Security Plans and facility security plans among port authorities, facility operators, and State and local government agencies required to provide port security services. The intent of the FY 2016 PSGP is to competitively award grant funding to assist Ports in obtaining the resources required to support the development and sustainment of core capabilities identified in the National Preparedness Goal of a secure and resilient Nation.

In FY 2016, PSGP will discontinue having two designated groupings; all port areas will be selected for funding through a competitive review process.

# **FY 2016 Transit Security Grant Program**

In FY 2016, the Transit Security Grant Program (TSGP) provides \$87,000,000 to the Nation's High-Threat Urban Areas for enhancement of security measures at critical transit infrastructure including bus, ferry, and rail systems. The intent of the FY 2016 TSGP is to competitively award grant funding to assist transit systems in obtaining the resources required to support the development and sustainment of core capabilities identified in the National Preparedness Goal of a secure and resilient Nation.

Funds will be awarded on a competitive basis for the following designated transit systems.

#### FY 2016 Emergency Management Performance Grant

In FY 2016, the Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) Program provides \$350,000,000 to assist state, local, tribal, and territorial governments in preparing for all hazards. In addition to this funding, FEMA must make available \$100,000 from the Disaster Relief Fund to the Federated States of Micronesia and the Republic of the Marshall Islands pursuant to Article X of the Federal Programs and Services Agreement of the Compact of Free Association Amendments Act (Pub. L. No. 108-188).

The EMPG is authorized by the *Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act*, as amended (42 U.S.C. § 5121 et seq.). Title VI of the Stafford Act authorizes FEMA to make grants for the purpose of providing a system of emergency preparedness for the protection of life and property in the United States from hazards and to vest responsibility for emergency preparedness jointly in the Federal Government and the states and their political subdivisions.

The intent of the FY 2016 EMPG is to provide grant funding to assist state and local emergency management agencies in obtaining the resources required to support the National Preparedness Goal's associated mission areas and core capabilities. The Federal Government, through the EMPG Program, provides necessary direction, coordination, guidance, and assistance, as authorized in this title so that a comprehensive emergency preparedness system exists for all hazards.
