

## Investments Supporting Partnerships In Recovery Ecosystems (INSPIRE) Initiative

The Investments Supporting Partnerships In Recovery Ecosystems (INSPIRE) Initiative uses federal resources to address workforce challenges caused by the Region's substance use crisis. This is a competitive grant program and as such the application process includes robust components and is subject to review and scoring.

Eligible funding uses include the following:

- Support of workforce development, healthcare, and substance use disorder (SUD) recovery services (those not treatment related) that address the SUD recovery to work ecosystem.
- Recovery-focused workforce and vocational training programs, including workforce reentry and employment retention, basic and advanced training, soft and hard-skill(s) development, upskilling, and clear career pathways for the purpose of connecting individuals in SUD recovery to meaningful employment.
- Coordination and linking of SUD recovery services and training that support the ecosystem, and engagement or reengagement in the workforce for this population.
