

Allegheny County Department of Public Works	This project will help reduce flood risk for communities along Turtle Creek, Thompson Run, and Brush Creek by removing debris from failed private walls, stabilizing hillside, relocating sediment, and making improvements at the Ardmore Debris Basin.	Allegheny County PA	\$1,471
City of Erie	This project will support the creation of an Emergency Operations Center in the City of Erie. The new center will facilitate coordination and collaboration among different law enforcement and first responder entities and will serve 14 counties.	Erie County PA	\$3,000
The Municipal Authority of the City of Sunbury	This project will allow for the replacement of a critical pipe system that protects the City of Sunbury from catastrophic flooding during times of heavy rainfall.	Northumberland County PA	\$748
City of Philadelphia Office of Emergency Management	Funding will support expansion of the main EOC area which the City of Philadelphia uses to coordinate joint disaster response and management for special events to increase the City's capacity to serve residents quickly in times of need.
